Course description

The module refers to level A1 of the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference). Students gain basic knowledge of German as a foreign language with a general language orientation while taking into consideration intercultural and cultural aspects. Students acquire teamwork skills through collaborative work in multinational mixed groups. After completion of this module, students will have acquired knowledge of everyday expressions and very simple sentences aimed at fulfilling the concrete needs of everyday life. Students can introduce themselves and others, ask others about themselves and answer similar questions, give simple descriptions of their day-to-day lives and briefly describe themselves in writing. They can communicate their wants and needs to others, provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.
